

Michelle's energy extended beyond the classroom and she was responsible for establishing, nurturing, coaching, and managing Water Polo teams at Wellesley. She was also one of the pioneers of the school's senior multisport programme which continues to provide worthwhile and hugely enjoyable activities for boys who prefer this to mainstream sports. Michelle's organisation of the Year 7 West Coast camps was legendary, and only the esteemed, now retired Steve Girvan attended more West Coast camps than Michelle! She also threw her endless efforts behind the Brookfield Camps, the Student Council, school productions, arts festivals and all the many events held over her years at Wellesley.

Michelle was a model of courage and integrity and demonstrated this right to the end. She was a much loved, dedicated, calm force behind the scenes who has left a lasting legacy and is missed by us all.
