WELLESLEY FACILITIES: Wellesley
College provides a wonderfully vibrant learning
environment, with well-resourced modern
classrooms, large outdoor playing spaces,
Library, Hall/Chapel facilities as well as
specialised subject classrooms; STEAM Room,
Art Studio and Performing Arts block. Across
the road is the beautiful Wellington Harbour
which we use frequently for outdoor activities.
Our International Hub is the centre of our
programme where students meet for ESOL
(English for Speakers of Other Languages) and
social events.



WELLINGTON Safe, politically stable and culturally diverse, New Zealand is ranked as one of the most peaceful countries in the world. Famous for its outstanding natural beauty, New Zealand offers a high standard of living, clean air, a healthy lifestyle and warm and friendly environment. Wellington is the capital city of New Zealand. It is a vibrant and beautiful harbour city located in the centre of New Zealand with many exciting places to see and visit on foot. It is the only capital city in the world to achieve World Health Organisation "Safe Community" status. A ferry trip across the harbour and a world away from the bustling capital city, Wellesley is surrounded by the bush and the sea.



DAYS BAY: One of seven small bays around the eastern margins of Wellington Harbour, this small idyllic location is serviced by a beautiful scenic road and a regular trans-harbour ferry service connecting the Days Bay and Wellington City. The seven bays are collectively considered to be part of Eastbourne with the surrounding hills providing important habitat for indigenous biodiversity and contain some of New Zealand's rarest and most-endangered plant species. Wellesley is located at the foot of these hills and is just across the road from one of many sheltered swimming beaches found along this stretch.



INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMME: Students are welcomed to our school with a comprehensive orientation, pastoral care and buddy system to assist with settling in. Pastoral care is an integral element and underpins daily interactions between staff and students. A member of our International Team is dedicated to the pastoral care of students and maintains close contact with parents. Dedicated specialist teachers provide classes including French, Visual Art, Music, Science, Drama and Physical Education. International students receive two ESOL (English for Speakers of Other Languages) sessions a week as part of their tuition fee. Students have exposure to a wide range of extracurricular activities and clubs such as Rock Band, Orchestra, Choir, Extension Art, Sports (such as Football, Water Polo and Basketball), Running Club, Robotics and Coding, Speech and Drama, Lego and Chess Clubs.

The International Team plan stimulating and exciting excursions to develop an understanding of New Zealand culture and our beautiful surroundings. These excursions are often combined with our sister school Chilton James – an all-girls private school in close proximity.

Wellesley provides individualised learning in small classes with a commitment to ensuring boys are nurtured and cared for as well as challenged to fulfil their potential.
