Hamish loved to travel and established a long career as a travel broker and became a specialist in secondary school sports travel. He loved the friendships and camaraderie involved in travel so much so that he only retired at age 73.

Hamish was the dearly loved partner of Claire, and former husband of Delia. He was also a much-loved father and father-in-law of Stephanie & Reece, Nick & Erica, Julia & Cort, and a proud 'Poppy' to his six grandchildren.

Since 2009, Claire and Hamish owned the Van Helden Gallery in Days Bay and Hamish was a much-loved member of the Days Bay community.

Sadly, Hamish passed away after a short illness on 23rd March 2021 at Wellington hospital, aged 76 years. A celebration of his life was held at Wellesley on 30th March 2021.
